
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## Parish of Our Lady of the Valley Catholic Primary Schools Newsletter Autumn 2016

## **Religious Education Autumn Overview**

### **St Mary's RC Primary School**

This term Class 1 are studying families. They will be thinking about Baptism, including their own. They will explore how all families are different and remembering how precious we all are in God's eyes.

Class 2 are also celebrating families, their own and the Family of God. They will be exploring what 'Love one another' means.

Class 3 are thinking about themselves, their talents and their qualities. Then they will look at their place in their community and explore the sacrament of marriage.

### **St Michael & St John's RC Primary School**

This term the whole school will be learning about The Family and the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, Marriage and the Priesthood. Reception will be learning about how God knows and loves each one or us. They will be finding out about how Baptism is a welcome to God's family. Year 1 is learning about how we each belong to our own family at home as well as God's family and how he cares for us. They will also find out about the Sacrament of Baptism and carry out a role play Baptism as well as visiting church. Year 2 will be learning about how God is at the beginning of everything. They will be learning about the signs and symbols of Baptism. In Year 3 the children will be learning about God's dream for every family and the promises that are made during the Baptism ceremony. Year 4 will be studying the family of God in Scripture. They will find out about the Sacrament of Confirmation and that God calls each of us to witness. Year 5 is finding out about ourselves and that we are created in the image and likeness of God. They will be finding out about life choices and the commitment of marriage. Year 6 will be learning about loving: God who never stops loving. They will also be learning about the vocation of priesthood and religious life.

### **Thorneyholme RC Primary School**

The children in the EYFS/KS1 are learning about Beginnings and how God is present in every beginning. They will also be learning about signs and symbols in Baptism and closer to our Lord's birthday; advent and how we prepare to celebrate Christmas.

In KS2, the children will explore in Scripture that Jesus had a natural family with real people with names and a history. Children will learn that through Baptism and Confirmation people are given the gift of the Holy Spirit and are called to respond in their lives. During advent, they will reflect on how God's gift of Jesus is a fit of love to all people of all time.

### **Suggested Family Fun Activities from St Mary's**

September 27th is the Feast day of St Vincent De Paul, have a look through your cupboards. Do you have unwanted items that you could donate to someone in need? Perhaps you could fill a bag with unwanted clothes and take them to a charity shop or donate food to a food bank?

Autumn is a beautiful time of year. Celebrate the joy of God's wonderful world by taking a nature walk. Really concentrating on all the beauty around you and giving thanks to God as you wonder at the marvels of His creation.
