More homework /weekend homework

Last year, we undertook a parental feedback survey regarding homework and following this we reviewed our homework policy and introduced weekly homework and 'pick and mix' grids to try to accommodate the fact that some parents wanted more homework and some wanted less. We do have links to activities and on line educational resources on our website for children who want to do extra work at home. In addition, we have recently purchased on line activities for spellings and times tables which the children can undertake as frequently as they wish.
